

First Ship Lease Trust ("FSL Trust") is a provider of leasing services on a bareboat charter basis to the international shipping industry.

FSL Trust was constituted under a Deed of Trust dated 19 March 2007 entered with FSL Trust Management Pte. Ltd. as its trustee-manager and was listed on the Singapore Exchange Securities Trading Limited ("SGX") on 27 March 2007.

As at 30 September 2012, FSL Trust has a modern, high quality and diverse portfolio of 25 vessels consisting of seven containerships, 11 product tankers, three chemical tankers, two crude oil tankers and two dry bulk carriers. Twenty-two vessels are employed on leases (20 vessels on long-term bareboat charters and two vessels on time charters) and have a dollar-weighted average remaining lease period of approximately five years (excluding extension periods and early buy-out options). The remaining three chemical tankers are employed in the chemical tanker pool market. The combined portfolio of 25 vessels has a dollar-weighted average age of approximately seven years.

The Trustee-Manager, on behalf of FSL Trust, has secured a 6-year amortising term loan facility with an outstanding loan balance of US\$446.6 million as at 30 September 2012.

In June 2012, the Trustee-Manager secured a temporary relaxation of two loan covenants from the lenders for 12 months until 30 June 2013 ("Relaxation Period"):

- (i) the minimum security value-to-loan ratio ("VTL") is reduced from 125% to 100%; and
- (ii) debt service coverage ratio is reduced from at least 1.1:1 to at least 1:1.

During the Relaxation Period, FSL Trust is restricted from paying any distributions to unitholders. In addition, a US\$10 million security deposit is placed with the security agent, and a levy of 2% per annum is imposed on the shortfall amount, which is the difference between the outstanding loan balance and the theoretical loan balance assuming VTL ratio is 125% (equivalent to approximately 20 basis points per annum, assuming valuation remains unchanged).

For 3Q 2012, the applicable margin over US\$ 3-month Libor was 3.0%. The VTL ratio will be assessed semi-annually.

The term loan is secured on the following:

- (i) a first priority mortgage over the Group's vessels in the portfolio;
- (ii) a first priority assignment of the Group's rights, title, interest in the insurances to and for each vessel, including insurance for hull and machinery, protection and indemnity and war risks; and
- (iii) a first priority assignment of the Group's rights, title and interest in and to the bareboat charter agreement and the charter income of each vessel.

FSL Trust has hedged its interest rate risk through a combination of interest rate swaps and/or natural hedges to fix the interest rates. The fixed interest rates range from 1.06% per annum to 5.24% per annum.

Revenue recognition for chemical tankers trading in the spot market and in a pool arrangement

When the chemical tankers were deployed in the chemical tanker spot market, freight income was recognised based on percentage of completion method calculated on a discharge-to-discharge basis over the voyage period.

In 3Q 2012, all three chemical tankers were delivered into the 'Nordic Siva' pool. The 'Nordic Siva' pool measures revenue based on the contractual rates and the duration of each voyage for each vessel, and revenue is recognised upon delivery of service in accordance with the terms and conditions of the charter parties on a time charter equivalent basis. Total pool revenue is derived by aggregating the revenues earned by each vessel participating in the pool.

#### 5. Change in the accounting policies and methods of computation (cont'd)

Revenue recognition for chemical tankers trading in the spot market and in a pool arrangement (cont'd)

Each vessel owner's share of the total pool revenue is primarily dependent on the i) number of days the vessel has been available for the pool in relation to the total available pool earning days during the period, and ii) pool points assigned to each vessel in the pool. Pool points are determined based on the size and performance of the vessel. The pool revenue is net of pool commission, bunkers costs and related voyage expenses.

#### **Depreciation on vessels**

### i) Chemical tankers-FSL New York, FSL London and FSL Tokyo

Following the lease payment default by the lessees of three chemical tankers, FSL New York, FSL London and FSL Tokyo (previously known as Pertiwi, Pujawati and Prita Dewi, respectively) in February 2012, these vessels were re-delivered to FSL Trust and were employed in the chemical spot market. With the pre-mature termination of the respective bareboat charter operating lease arrangements, the expected useful life of each of the three vessels has been revised from 12 years to 25 years and the basis of estimating the respective residual values has also changed.

The changes in the expected useful life and residual value of the vessels constitute a change in estimates. The effects of the change have been applied prospectively from January 2012 as the payment default was assessed to be an adjusting post-balance sheet event for the year ended 31 December 2011. The change reduces depreciation expense for the current quarter by US\$1.0 million (YTD Sep 2012: US\$3.0 million) for the three vessels.

#### ii) Product tankers-TORM Margrethe and TORM Marie

In April 2012, the various stakeholders of TORM A/S ("TORM") (including FSL Trust) agreed upon a restructuring plan, which was subsequently signed on 2 October 2012. Under the restructuring agreement, the various early-buyout and purchase options are cancelled and the contracted bareboat charter rates are realigned to rates that TORM achieves in the tanker market. In view of these revised terms, the expected useful life of each of the two vessels has been revised from 7 years to 25 years and the basis of estimating the respective residual values has also changed.

The changes in the expected useful life and residual value of the vessels constitute a change in estimates. The effects of the change have been applied prospectively from April 2012. The change reduces depreciation expense for the current quarter by US\$0.27 million (YTD Sep 2012: US\$0.53 million) for the two vessels.

#### 8. Review of Performance

During the quarter under review, the three chemical tankers entered the 'Nordic Siva' pool and the second product tanker commenced its 3-year fixed rate time charter arrangement with Petròleo Brasileiro S.A. ("Petrobras"). Whilst the revenue earned by the three chemical tankers are not fixed, volatility in earnings is reduced due to the nature of the pool arrangement in which all the vessels in the pool share their earnings based on their respective pool points (see paragraph 5).

The bareboat charter rentals derived from the longer term lease of the majority of FSL Trust's vessels continued to support the overall earnings of FSL Trust.

Rentals from vessels on bareboat charter fell 22.6% to US\$18.3 million primarily from i) the payment default by the subsidiaries of PT Berlian Laju Tanker Tbk for the three chemical tankers since February 2012 and ii) lower rentals from vessels leased to TORM as the leases were being restructured. The restructuring agreement was subsequently finalised in October 2012 (see paragraph 11 for Subsequent Event).

#### Time charter

FSL Singapore entered the time-charter arrangement with Petrobras since 16 May 2012, hence she enjoyed the full three months of time charter income from Petrobras. On the other hand, FSL Hamburg only entered a similar time charter arrangement on 23 August 2012 at a gross daily time charter rate of US\$14,000. On a combined basis, these two vessels contributed BBCE revenue of US\$1.0 million in the quarter under review.

#### <u>Pool</u>

The 'Nordic Siva' pool commenced deployment of the three chemical tankers in this quarter. The deployment was staggered: two vessels entered the pool in July 2012 while the third vessel joined the pool in August 2012. Collectively, these vessels generated net pool revenue of US\$2.9 million. After deducting vessel operating expenses, these vessels earned BBCE revenue of US\$1.4 million in the quarter under review.

For this analysis, depreciation expense on dry-docking costs is included in vessel operating expenses in deriving BBCE revenue.

#### 8. Review of Performance (cont'd)

#### Spot

Spot revenues were derived from the three chemical tankers before they entered the 'Nordic Siva' pool as well as from *FSL Hamburg* before she started her time charter arrangement with Petrobras. Total freight income generated by these vessels amounted to US\$3.8 million. After deducting voyage and vessel operating expenses, these vessels generated BBCE revenue of US\$1.8 million in this quarter. For the same period last year, the spot BBCE revenue of US\$172,000 was contributed by *FSL Hamburg* and *FSL Singapore*.

Other operating expenses declined 8.0% (-US\$1.4 million) to US\$16.0 million in 3Q 2012. The lower expenditure was due mainly to lower depreciation from the chemical tankers (-US\$1.0 million) and from the vessels leased to TORM (-US\$0.3 million), arising from the changes in the expected useful life and residual value of the vessels.

The resulting net operating income for the entire portfolio of 25 vessels reached US\$6.5 million, a marginal improvement of 1.0% over the same period last year. After accounting for finance expenses and other non-operating items, FSL Trust incurred a small loss of US\$186,000 compared to a small profit of US\$152,000 for the same period last year.

In connection with a temporary relaxation of two of the loan covenants under the amortising term loan facility, FSL Trust is restricted from paying any distributions to unitholders until 30 June 2013.

#### 10. Outlook and Prospects

The Trustee-Manager expects earnings from the vessel portfolio to be more stable following the successful redeployment of the two product tankers and three chemical tankers from spot market to time charter and pool employment respectively. Together with the loan covenant relaxation previously obtained from FSL Trust's lenders, the operational profile of FSL Trust has improved and FSL Trust is in good stead to ride out the challenges ahead.

However, the Trustee-Manager believes that some lessees continue to be under pressure and there is possibility of further downside risks. The Trustee-Manager will remain vigilant in managing FSL Trust's vessel portfolio responsibly to secure a sustainable future for FSL Trust.

#### 11. Subsequent Event

FSL Trust currently leases two product tankers (*TORM Margrethe* and *TORM Marie*) to a wholly-owned subsidiary of TORM A/S ("TORM"). The vessels are leased on bareboat charters for lease term of seven years each.

On 2 October 2012, TORM announced the signing of a restructuring agreement with its banks and tonnage providers that will secure for TORM substantial deferral of its bank debt, new liquidity and savings from its restructured time charter book<sup>2</sup>. Subject to the technical completion of the restructuring agreement, which is expected within four weeks of signing, tonnage providers, including FSL Trust, who have agreed to permanently amend their charter contracts, will receive in aggregate a 17.3% equity stake in the enlarged share capital of TORM. FSL Trust's shareholding in the enlarged capital is approximately 2.5%.

As part of TORM's restructuring agreement, the Trustee-Manager had previously agreed to and obtained formal approval from its lenders for the realignment of the charter terms for the two TORM product tankers. The main realigned terms are:-

- a) bareboat charter rates for the two product tankers will be variable rates that TORM achieves in the market; and
- b) the early buyout, purchase and lease extension options in the original agreements are cancelled.

In addition, FSL Trust has the option to terminate the two charters before their maturity in 2018 if TORM underperforms the market benchmark rates by a pre-agreed margin, tested semi-annually.

This event does not have a material impact on the financial results for the quarter ended 30 September 2012.
